Leader: God, we are sinners; have mercy on us.

People: Forgive us, merciful God. Open our hearts and minds to follow Your ways of love, justice, and peace.

Leader: As we turn from our self-centered ways and open ourselves to God's mercy, we find meaning for our lives and hope for our future. My friends, hear and remember the good news of the Gospel:
